#### I. PREFACE

Hokkaido University Liaison Office in Indonesia (LO Hokudai) was established in June 2017 and located in IPB University, Gedung Pascasarjana Dramaga Campus R-200, Bogor 16680, West Java, Indonesia to provide information and services regarding Hokkaido University to Indonesian students and academic staff. The office is open every weekday (09.00 - 16.00) and closed on the weekends and Indonesian public holidays.

#### II. ACTIVITY IN HOKKAIDO UNIVERSITY LIAISON OFFICE IN INDONESIA

LO Hokudai provides information and services regarding Hokkaido University. The international academic information such as research opportunities, summer school program, student exchange program, scholarship program, and other related academic program from Hokkaido University in regards to the partnership with IPB University were informed through the LO Hokudai. Herewith are the activities of Hokkaido University Liaison Office in Indonesia. Recapitulation of LO Hokudai daily activities during October - December 2019 are shown in Table 1.

As could be seen from table 1, the overall activities of LO Hokudai were to disseminate to visitors about the academic, scholarship and short-term exchange information of Hokkaido University through welcoming direct visits and through LO Hokudai Social Media and announcement board. To welcome the new volunteers of the LO, a welcoming party and orientation session were held in October.

The LO also pioneered an information sharing session to announce the upcoming PARE Spring Program 2020 in Thailand. This event was very successful to create interest and awareness of the PARE program to IPB students. Two of the participants from IPB found about PARE program through the information session.

In December, Prof. Hanny had an opportunity to visit UC Davis (USA) to meet with other Hokudai partners to increase academic and research collaborations. The LO also welcomed a visit from the representatives of Seoul National University during their visit to IPB. They were surprised of the existence of a liaison office and were interested in creating one as well.

#### **III. OPERATING HOURS**

The daily operation of LO Hokudai is supported by volunteers consisting of a Professor as well as students (graduate and undergraduate). The composition of volunteer in LO Hokudai with each duty in supporting the office is described in Table 2.

To alleviate the burden of the volunteers, each volunteer has a different shift schedule as informed in appendix 1 (Volunteer Schedule October – December 2019). Other volunteers would fill a schedule if a volunteer was not able to attend his/her allotted time.

#### **IV. VISITORS OF LO HOKUDAI**




Figure 1. Number of Visitor of LO Hokudai during October - December 2019




Figure 2. Visitor Purpose of LO Hokudai during October - December 2019

As could be seen from Figure 1, the LO Hokudai had a huge increase in the number of visitors because of the PARE sharing session held in that month. This greatly increased the visibility of LO Hokudai at IPB University. Figure 2 showed that the main purpose of the visitors was to attend the PARE sharing session (53.5%) as well as to have academic consultation (20.9%), general visiting (14%) and to inquire about scholarship opportunity at Hokudai (11.67%). Such information sharing session greatly increased the awareness of the IPB students about Hokudai and its liaison office.

### IV. PARE PROGRAM INFORMATION SHARING SESSION

On November 2, 2019, the Liaison Office, in collaboration with Bogor Science Club (BSC), organized a PARE program information session similar to the one held in Hokkaido University by the PARE office to socialize the PARE program especially to IPB University students and other attendees as well. The event was led by Sigit and Choirul, and was supported by other volunteers of the LO Hokudai as well.




Figure 3. Source of information about the event

The event was socialized through LO Hokudai Instagram account, WhatsApp, e-mail, BSC members, and IPB graduate school announcement. To attend the event, a google form was created to tabulate the prospective attendees since the event was limited to 30 attendees due to space constriction. Twenty seven (27) people registered for the event but only 15 people showed up for the event. Seven (7) additional people registered for the event on the spot, giving a total of 22 attendees. It was found (Figure. 3) that most of the registrants knew about the event from friends and from BSC. Only a fraction of the registrants knew about the event from Graduate School announcement and Hokudai LO Instagram. This clearly showed that personal communication and collaboration with other organizations such as BSC were very important to announce other events such as this and maximize the number of attendees.

The event was opened by Prof. Nahrowi as the representative of IPB Graduate School and was guided by Riska as the event moderator. During the event, three main topics were presented: Introduction of Hokkaido University Liaison Office which was presented by Alexander, Introduction to PARE program which was presented by Sigit, and PARE Program Experience Sharing Session was presented by Choirul and Irena. The event took place for about 2 hours and many questions were asked during the Q&A session. Most of which were about the experience joining PARE program, scholarship opportunities, financing, language and GPA requirements.




Figure 4. Usefulness of the event to the attendees (0 = not useful at all - 5 = very useful)




Figure 5. Interest of the responders to join the PARE Spring program 2020




Figure 6. Reason of interest in joining the Spring program




Figure 7. Reason of disinterest in joining the Spring program

After the event, we followed up to the attendees by means of Google Form to obtain their feedback on the event so that we can improve Hokudai LO future events. Out of the 22 attendees, 8 people responded and gave their feedback. Overall, all responders felt that the event was very helpful, as shown in Figure 4. When further asked about their intention to apply for the PARE Spring Program, 62.5% of the responders were interested in applying for the because of the program content and goals, however, English language requirement and lack of scholarship were the main reason for the responders to lack of interest in joining the spring program showed in (Figure.5, 6, 7).




Figure 8. Reason of interest in joining the Summer program





Figure 9. Reason of disinterest in joining the Summer program

On the contrary, 100% of the responders were interested in joining the PARE summer 2020 program mostly because of the program content and goals, the location, and the availability of scholarship (Figure. 8). Similarly, English language requirement were the main hindrance for the responders to join the PARE summer program (Figure.9).

When the responders were finally asked about their intent to apply for the program, six responders were willing to apply for the Summer program while three people are planning to apply for the PARE Spring Program (Figure. 10). After following up with IPB Graduate School, two of the responders (Ester and Karel) applied for the PARE Spring program, managed to pass the initial selection and were finally accepted to the program.



This result clearly showed that the event managed to better inform IPB students about the importance of PARE program and sparked some interest to finally apply for the program as well as to educate them to better prepare themselves to apply for the program, especially in the English language requirement. Because of this recent success of the event, the Liaison Office should plan to hold another info session with better preparation and socialization in regards of the PARE Summer 2020 program so that the program could obtain highly motivated and qualified students and prepare them to tackle PARE related issues in the future.
